Flood, Festival & Field Day

Flood. For the first time in 100 years, no make that 500 years, Johnson County authorities were swamped with calls for help. Nearly a foot of rain fell across Johnson County and most of the counties in south central Indiana. By 7AM Saturday morning, June 7th, county emergency management personnel knew

they had a serious problem. By 8AM, EMA Director Tug Sutton activated RACES. Jack, W8ISH, and Dave, KB9LOT, made their way through rapidly rising waters to staff the EOC radio room. Radio coverage from the EOC into the new repeater was poor at best. A faulty antenna forced Jack & Dave to relay messages through Brenda KC9EBL, operating from her home in Franklin. The American Radio Relay League would have been proud of our efforts. Our flood net secured about 12 hours later.

During the course of the day 18 Amateur Radio operators across the county reported high water that closed dozens of roads. Their reports were inputted into the county WebEOC computer system. It gave county officials a better idea of which roads were passable. The input from hams proved invaluable. All county emergency resources were tied up with high water rescues.

By 10AM, county commissioners had declared a state of emergency. Amateur Radio operators were encouraged to use caution and continue to report flooded roads. At last count, eight county bridges were closed and dozens of county roads severely

damaged. By noon Princes Lake Dam breached spilling millions of gallons of water through the levy. Dozens of residents were rescued from the lake region and other parts of Johnson County.

Franklin PD lost their dispatch center and offices late in the afternoon. County officials watched helplessly as live video from news choppers showed Franklin dispatchers being rescued by boat. The damage to Johnson County and its citizens is in the millions of dollars. EMA Director Tug Sutton praised the work of Amateur Radio operators in helping with damage assessment and keeping the lines of communication open during the great flood of '08. -w8ish

Strawberry Festival. Sunny skies and warm temperatures provided a great day to hold the annual White River Township Fire Department Strawberry Festival. MARC members took advantage of the weather and crowds to demonstrate Amateur Radio.

The ARRL Flag flew from the pole in front of Pleasant Grove Elementary School. Most festival visitors did not notice the 40-meter sloper attached to the halyard. Steve-K9DY was working SSB contacts warming up for the Field Day marathon. Chris-KG6IZJ sat nearby with a desk mic working 20-meters using a R7 vertical antenna. Both powered their radios deep cycle batteries. Jack-W8ISH provided the 12 x 12-foot tent. Linda-KC9GCH came prepared with small tables, chairs and lots of Amateur Radio info for the guests.

The sunny weather and lots of fresh strawberries and ice cream beckoned the

Strawberry Festival - Part 2. During the Strawberry Festival, Steve Carmean, K9DY, used a Ten Tec Scout 555 @ 50 watts on 40 meters for sSB and CW. The antenna was a 40 meter, Par End-Fedz sloper attached to a flagpole on end and a tree on the other. Portable power was supplied by a 12 volt deep cycle battery. Conditions were poor but Steve contacted stations in West Virginia, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Texas, Minnesota, and Missouri with this setup. Chris Frederick, KG6ZIJ, operated on 20 meters using a Kenwood TS-2000 HF/VHF/UHF radio, a Cushcraft R-7, 40M - 10M antenna and a Radial-Larsen NMO 2/70 (2M-70cm) antenna. Chris was able to make two contacts, once a special event station and another station in Idaho.

Field Day. The June 28, 2008 ARRL Field Day operation for the Mid-State Amateur Radio Club took place in Craig Park in Greenwood. That morning, a few (fool) hardy individuals assembled at the Greenwood VFW post. Club members had to circumvent various roadblocks to avoid the Safety Festival parade. It seemed every possible access road to the Field Day site was closed for the parade.

Bob, KC9NJM, was the first to arrive, followed by Steve, K9DY, and Linda, KC9GCH. Marc, KC9CCM, and Steve, N9LC arrived later. We waited a couple hours for the arrival of the Johnson County communications van to begin setting up. We

wanted to be near the van and use it as our base of operation. The van was finally parked near the ball fields around 11 A.M. Greenwood Police allowed us to park our vehicles near the van so we could begin Field Day setup.

We used 20 and 40 meter wire antennas, strung at 10-15 feet up in trees. Our primary HF radio was a Ten Tec Scout with 50 watt output SSB using battery power for all our contacts.

Due to high winds and threatening thunderstorms, we set up on a card table near the rear of an open SUV in case we had to close station on short notice. We made a few test contacts prior to the official start time to make sure we were "on the air". Most reports were 5-9.

When the official time came, it quickly became apparent we were at a disadvantage in the pileups. Our rig and antennas were quite modest compared with the competition, but we persevered. We only operated for about two and a half hours and managed to get 14 contacts with 12 sections in 12 states. Linda conducted tours of the command vehicle and did P.R. as visitors inquired as to what we were doing.

We did have one surprise from Mother Nature. Just after getting set up a large tree branch fell into the parking lot two slots from our operating position. It was left hanging from a previous storm. Strong winds on Field Day caused it to come loose and crash down where one of our vehicles had been parked minutes earlier. That woke us up. We were now alert and ready to go. It seems like a good field day has to be fought against natural hazards. Next year we may abandon the safety of the Greenwood Safety Festival and find a remote spot out with nature to conduct Field Day 2009. -Steve K9DY ■

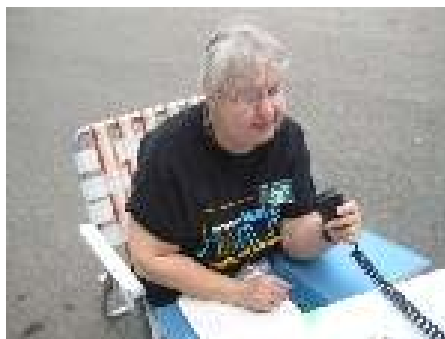
